Some Valentine's Day Fun Facts:



"Wear Your Heart on Your Sleeve": In medieval times, people drew names to be Valentines and wore them on their sleeves for a week.

Letters to "Juliet": Every year, thousands of letters addressed to Juliet (of *Romeo and Juliet* fame) arrive in Verona, Italy, where volunteers known as "Juliet's Secretaries" answer them.

A "sweet" medicinal origin: Those iconic candy hearts began as medical lozenges. In 1847, Boston pharmacist Oliver Chase invented a machine to simplify lozenge production, later shifting to candy which became the "Conversation Hearts" we know today.

Cards Galore: It's the second-largest card-sending holiday after Christmas, with 145 million exchanged in the U.S. alone (not including kids' classroom valentines). The first Valentine's Day celebration occurred in Paris.

Heart-Shaped Chocolates: Richard Cadbury created the first heart-shaped chocolate box in the 1860s, and over 36 million are sold yearly.
